

## Superyacht Legacy 50th to list on Langkawi registry

SUPERYACHT Legacy has created a new milestone after being named the 50th yacht to be registered by Langkawi International Yacht Registry (LIYR).

Legacy, soon to be re-named Nymphaea after an extensive refit, is a classic 33-m beauty built in 1984 by Broward Marine shipyards in Florida.

Simpson Marine is the central agency for the charter of Legacy after its refit.

Simpson Marine said in a statement the yacht offered a maximum speed of 14 knots and a cruising range of 3,000 miles.

“Legacy is the epitome of luxury and comfort with large indoor saloons and ample outdoor space. Accommodation is available for nine guests in four cabins,” it said.

LIYR, which operates under the office of the director-general of Marine Malaysia, is designed for yacht owners seeking to operate under the advantages of an open registry.

With no restriction on ownership and open to any individual, joint owners, corporations and yachting entities, the LIYR is capturing the attention of more international boat owners, drawing them into Malaysian waters.

According to Simpson Marine charter manager Rico Stapel, the growing marine infrastructure in the region and ideal cruising waters of Langkawi made the area the perfect charter destination.

“As a duty free island, Langkawi has many advantages and is easily accessible throughout Asia.

“The area is attracting more and more mega yachts that are keen to register with the LIYR,” he said.
