THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ORDINANCE, 1952

(No. 70 of 1952)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 519 of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1952, the High Commissioner in Council hereby alters the fees prescribed in the Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Thirteenth Schedules to the said Ordinance, as follows:

FOURTH SCHEDULE

For the fees of \$80, \$120, \$150 and \$250 appearing in the right hand column *substitute* respectively fees of \$100, \$200, \$300 and \$375.

Delete the words and figure "And for every additional 300 tons or part thereof above 600 tons an additional \$30" and *substitute* therefor the following:

For every additional 300 tons or part of 300 tons up to a total tonnage of 21,000 tons, an additional	75	00
For every additional 300 tons or part of 300 tons, exceeding a total tonnage of 21,000, and not exceeding a total tonnage of 39,000 tons an additional	60	00
For every additional 300 tons or part of 300 tons exceeding a total tonnage of 39,000 tons . . .	30	00

FIFTH SCHEDULE

For the figure "\$10.00" *substitute* the figure "\$25.00", and for the words "twenty dollars" *substitute* the words "fifty dollars."

SIXTH SCHEDULE

For the fees of \$10, \$20 and \$50 appearing as the third, fourth and fifth items in the right hand column *substitute* respectively fees of \$30, \$50 and \$125.

Delete the first two and the last two items in the Schedule.

THIRTEENTH SCHEDULE

PART II

For the fees of \$30, \$40, \$5 and \$3 appearing in column (a) at the beginning of this Part *substitute* respectively fees of \$75, \$100, \$12 and \$8.

For the fees of \$15, \$20, \$3 and \$2 appearing in column (b) *substitute* respectively fees of \$40, \$50, \$8 and \$5.

For the fees of \$5, \$8, \$1 and \$1 appearing in column (c) *substitute* respectively fees of \$15, \$20, \$3 and \$3.

For the figure "\$50" appearing in rule 2 *substitute* the figure "\$125".

For the figure "\$20" appearing in rule 3 *substitute* the figure "\$60".

For the figure "\$5" appearing in rule 4 *substitute* the figure "\$10".

For the figure "\$20" appearing twice in rule 5 *substitute* in each case the figure "\$50".

For the figures "\$5" and "\$20" appearing in rules 6 and 7 *substitute* respectively the figures "\$10" and "\$50".

For the words "ten dollars" and "twenty dollars" appearing respectively in paragraphs 1 and 2 substitute respectively the words "thirty dollars" and "fifty dollars".

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ORDINANCE, 1952

(No. 70 of 1952)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 (5) (c) of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1952, the High Commissioner in Council hereby prescribes the following fees to be charged for inspections and other services performed by Surveyors of Ships and Radio Surveyors as the case may be:

(1) *Fees for Inspection of Life Saving Appliances (Section 261).*

- (i) For inspection of life-saving appliances on a ship on or before first registry or re-registry, a fee of \$75.00 for ships under 500 tons gross and \$125.00 for ships of 500 tons gross and over shall be charged including issue of certificate.
- (ii) For subsequent inspection of Life Saving Appliances at the request of the owner, master or agent, or in the case of a ship found to have defective or deficient Life Saving Appliances, a fee of \$50.00 shall be charged, including the issue of the certificate.
- (iii) For inspection, during construction, of each buoyant apparatus or life raft a fee of \$5.00 shall be charged, with a minimum fee of \$20.00.
- (iv) For the inspection and stamping of new or recovered life jackets at maker's works, the fee of \$10.00 shall be charged for each hundred or fraction of a hundred.

(2) *Fee for a Special Passenger and Safety Certificate.*
For each such certificate \$60.00

(3) *Fee for Annual Survey of Wireless Telegraphy Installation.*
For each report of inspection of a wireless telegraphy installation on board a ship \$50.00

(4) *Fee for Survey Abroad.*

In cases where the High Commissioner decides to allow a survey to be made abroad by a Surveyor of Ships, in addition to the usual survey fees and all the Surveyor's expenses incurred in this connection, a fee of \$200.00 shall be charged for every 24 hours or part of 24 hours during which the Surveyor is absent from the port at which he is stationed.

All fees and a deposit to cover the additional charges shall be paid into the Treasury in advance and an undertaking given for the payment of any balance of fees and expenses connected with the service.
